	<p>Students usually begin this math sequence in 8th or 9th grade, depending on readiness, but <u>must</u> begin Algebra 1 no later than 9th grade in order to meet all graduation requirements within 4 years.</p> <p>Algebra 2 and Geometry can be taken in any order. Most students will need a fourth math beyond these two classes for graduation.</p>

	<p>Math and science courses are interdependent, so please verify prerequisites for each.</p> <p>Chemistry and Anatomy &amp; Physiology can be taken in any order, however, students are most successful when Chemistry is taken first.</p>

		<p>Students can begin this sequence at any time, so long as they finish prior to graduation. Also, students must have two years of the same language for graduation.</p>

		<p>These classes can be taken concurrently and in any order.</p>
